DATA SUMMARY

The Hillsboro cluster has the highest-performing zoned schools, with every middle and elementary school's achievement scores exceeding the state average.

JT Moore and West End are the only zoned middle schools in MNPS to meet or exceed the statewide achievement average. Hillsboro High is the highest performing zoned high school in Nashville and also has the second highest graduation rate.

Still, 26% of the students are chronically absent, enrollment drops by half between elementary and middle, and only one-third of graduates are considered ready for college and career.
